

Uisguebeatha

(Scotch Whisky – Water of Life)

Originally a drink for the working class, whisky has developed into a group of spirits offering incredible depth and variety. However, you don't always need to get caught up in tasting notes and identifying complexities: remember that a quality whisky is like a quality wine; if you like it, then it is good!

Highlands

Glenmorangie Original

Nose offers fruit, butterscotch and toffee with vanilla, fruit soft tannins and peat combining for a warm finish

Springbank 10yo

Bright gold colour. Moderate aromas of sweet toasty grains, potpourri, and lanolin scented peat. Some fresh citrus peel notes emerge with time in the glass. The palate is very soft upon entry, building with good length and concentration

Lowlands

Ailsa Bay Sweet Smoke

The first in the world to index 'sweetness' this whisky has been crafted by William Grant and Sons. It is renowned for it's rich vanilla and oaky taste, fresh wood smoke aroma with notes of rich peatiness, fresh candied orange peel and oak sweetness

Auchentoshan

Light, sweet and smooth in the mouth, with citrus fruit, cloves and a gingery finish

Glenkinchie

Light flowery nose with a hint of grass and cucumber. Palate is barley with a touch of spice and an earthy note.

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Speyside

Glenlivet

Lovely honeyed, floral and fragrant nose with a smooth malt and vanilla sweetness on the palate

Glenfiddich 12yo

Classic rich fruit and barley nose with a sharp malt palate and warming finish.

The Macallan 12yo

Abundant fruit combined with sweet syrup. The solid oak rounds out a good lengthy finish

The Islands

Talisker (Skye) 10yo

A complex dense smoky nose with sweet fruit and fish that delivers dark chocolate, ginger and black pepper in a spicy smoky tail.

Isle of Jura

A resin, oil and pine note to the nose that combines to deliver a light malty, nutty and salt finish with a hint of smoke.

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Islay Malts

Ardbeg 10yo (Islay)

Traditionally the smokiest of whiskeys with over 50 phenol parts per million. With its deep, smoky notes with luscious, raisiny tones of old ex-Sherry casks, it's non-chill-filtered at high strength whilst retaining maximum flavor

Bunnahabhain (Islay) 12yo

Restrained for an Islay, the Bunnahabhain has a fresh nose with not too much peat. The smoke is more overt on the palate, along with nuts and fruits. The finish is long and full bodied, with hints of vanilla.

Laphroaig 10yo (Islay)

Salt, peat, seaweed and tar in a glorious nose that's followed by a massive palate with fish oil & plankton, culminating in a long phenolic and peaty finish.
